The strength, ingenuity and talents of Queensland's public galleries and museums were triumphantly demonstrated tonight with the announcement of the winners of the **2017 Gallery and Museum Achievement Awards** (GAMAA) at a gala presentation event, proudly hosted by Old Government House, QUT.

Jennifer Garcia, Communications and Programming Manager, Newstead House, was recognised as a Finalist for her outstanding achievement in the category of 'Individuals Paid.'

For the past five years, Jennifer Garcia has been employed as the Communications and Programming Manager at Newstead House, Brisbane. This position was newly created, and during this time Jennifer has helped reimagine the house museum by re-engaging with the local community through innovative public programing, events, research, community partnerships, collaborations, and education projects. Jennifer's work has greatly augmented and enhanced Newstead House's profile as a cultural and heritage precinct and a destination for domestic and international visitors.

These accolades embody outstanding examples of our sector's achievements, professional excellence, and innovation. They also highlight the valuable contribution and achievements of professionals and volunteers working in our industry."

The GAMAA were established by Museums & Galleries Queensland in 2004 to honour the achievements of our state's individuals and organisations in striving towards excellence.
