Finalist at State Awards

The Winners and Finalists of the **2019 Gallery and Museum Achievement Awards** (GAMAA) were proudly announced on Thursday 19 September at a special presentation event, held at the recently opened Cairns Performing Arts Centre, Far North Queensland.

Queensland State Archives was recognised as a **Finalist** for its outstanding achievement in the category of Engagement: Organisations with Paid Staff for its program, *The Memory Lounge*.

Queensland State Archives (QSA) holds the State's memories and through The Memory Lounge – a purpose-built dementia-friendly space – is now helping the community share their own memories.

QSA's Memory Lounge aims to value, respect and actively engage older people in the community. The lounge area provides a comfortable and welcoming space inspired by mid-century interiors, with furnishings selected to accommodate people living with dementia.

Visitors can relax and browse through photo albums of images from the Archives, watch films from the 1950s and 60s, and share memories over morning tea. Attendees leave with a copy of a photograph to take home to continue conversations about personal memories and past experiences.
