CULTURAL FUND

Funds: \$5,000 - \$20,000

Closes: 11 May 2020, 12 June 2020

Purpose: The Cultural Fund provides support to organisations for projects that deliver opportunities for authors, journalists, artists and key industry stakeholders in the writing, publishing, education, and visual arts sectors.

Eligible applicants: Legally constituted organisations and incorporated associations.

Eligible projects: Activities supported include skills development and professional development opportunities for writers and visual arts and people working in publishing; artists' fees for new commissions presented by art galleries; mentorships, residencies, internships for writers, visual artists and publishers; writers' and visual artists' fees for industry-led conferences; writers' and visual artists' fees for projects with educational and cultural institutions; awards and prizes for writers and visual artists; professional development programs run by writing, publishing and visual arts industry associations; Indigenous-led organisations to deliver projects to benefit Indigenous writers and visual artists.

Ineligible projects: The Cultural Fund does not support activities of projects where writers or visual artists are not paid a fee; community-based writing programs; university-based writer/artist-in-residency programs which do not connect with audiences outside the university; translations into other languages; projects which do not connect with audiences; publishing and exhibition costs; website development or maintenance costs; digitisation of catalogues of work; business or overhead costs; capital and building works; staff salaries; exhibition openings.

CUSTODIANSHIP PROGRAM

Funds: Variable

Purpose: The Custodianship program is designed by First Nations leaders for First Nations leaders to transform sustainability in culture, practice, community and the arts.

Eligible applicants: Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artists, arts workers and cultural practitioners from across art forms and Australia. Participants who have roots with their custodianship responsibilities and want to learn more about enacting a vision for their communities.

Eligible projects: Will cover fees and travel costs associated with the program.

INDIGENOUS LANGUAGES AND ARTS PROGRAM

Australian Government – Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Communications

Funds: Up to \$100,000 a year for up to 2 years

Closes: 30 June 2020

Purpose: Supports Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities to revive and maintain languages, and to develop and present art.

Eligible applicants: Organisations that support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities through languages and arts. Applicants must be a separate legal entity, such as an incorporated association or a company with an Australian Business Number (ABN) and be registered for the Goods and Services Tax (GST), if required by the Australian Tax Office.

Eligible projects: Eligible projects include, but are not limited to: multi-media arts or languages projects that engage young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, traditional Indigenous arts and craft production, film, contemporary or traditional music production or performance, photography and arts, traditional storytelling, the teaching of languages.

INDIGENOUS REGIONAL ARTS DEVELOPMENT FUND

Queensland Government

Funds: Up to \$25,000
Closes: 6 February 2020

Purpose: Supports keeping culture strong through passing on of cultural knowledge and practice by recognised, respected Elders, leaders and peers; and supports activities where the community and individuals are engaged in arts practice, skills development and participation.

Eligible projects: Funds can be distributed to a variety of individuals and groups such as local artists, cultural workers or community members.

Eligible applicants: Indigenous Council and host organisations.

INDIGENOUS VISUAL ARTS INDUSTRY SUPPORT PROGRAM

Australian Government – Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Communications

Funds: \$5,000 - \$80,000

Closes: 16 March 2020

Purpose: Helps fund the operations of around 80 Indigenous-owned art centres, and a number of art fairs, regional hubs and industry service organisations that are at the heart of Australia's world-famous Indigenous visual art movement.

Eligible applicants: Organisations that support professional Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artists to produce, promote and market their art such as remote art centres, industry service organisations, art fairs and arts hubs (regional and urban locations).

Eligible projects:

- Support the operations of Indigenous visual art centres, hubs, marketing events and service organisations that provide professional support to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artists in the production, promotion and marketing of their art
- Provide opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artists to develop, extend, market and generate income from their professional visual art practice
- Provide employment and economic opportunities in the visual arts industry for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, particularly in remote communities
- Provide opportunities for art centre staff, artists and board members to develop professional skills and gain experience
- Contribute to strengthening the Indigenous visual art industry, including the delivery of professional services and support by industry service organisations.

NAIDOC WEEK GRANT

Australian Government – National Indigenous Australians Agency

Funds: A total of \$1.4 million

Closes: Suspended until further notice

Purpose: To support events and activities that celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture.

Eligible applicants: Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non-Indigenous legal entities may apply for NAIDOC funding. Where both Indigenous and non-Indigenous organisations are found suitable preference will typically be given to the Indigenous organisation.

Eligible projects: Activities should be held during NAIDOC Week - 5-12 July 2020. Activities include:

- Arts based activities, including painting, dancing, crafts, storytelling
- Family fun days
- Cultural activities
- Elders activities
- Bush tucker and other community cooking activities
- NAIDOC themed sporting activities or competitions
- Activities that actively promote reconciliation
- Flag raising ceremonies with accompanying activities
- Activities that promote health outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
