# **Funding Criteria**

- Quality artistic achievement, contribution to growing the arts sector and strengthening Queensland's community of arts
- Reach ability to respond to and stimulate demand, providing access to, participation in and positive experiences of arts across Queensland
- Impact articulation of public value and demonstration of cultural, social, artistic and/or economic outcomes
- Viability effective management and governance capabilities supported by financial and entrepreneurial capacity and a viable, value for money proposal

### **Assessment**

- Arts Queensland competitive funding programs are assessed by external peer assessors, with relevant artform/arts industry experience
- Assessors are drawn from the community
- Assessors make recommendations against specific fund/program criteria which are then approved by the Minister for the Arts
- Since1 July 2016, Arts Queensland is inviting expressions of interest to join the peer assessor panel through a rolling register at <a href="www.arts.qld.gov.au">www.arts.qld.gov.au</a>

# Tips for completing funding applications

- Read program guidelines before completing application
- Demonstrate audience demand or community need for your project and broader public benefit
- Be clear about nature of your project or program
- Clearly articulate your value proposition
- Ensure you demonstrate outputs, outcomes and impact of your project or program
- Make sure your budget balances
- Be concise, articulate and make your application stand out
- Seek help before you complete the application
