QLD's galleries and museums recognised in State Awards

Queensland's public galleries and museums were formally recognised at the **2016 Gallery and Museum Achievement Awards** (GAMAA) at a gala event proudly presented by Museums & Galleries Queensland and hosted by Creative Arts Redlands – Redland Performing Arts Centre and Redland Art Gallery, on Tuesday 22 November 2016.

Museum of Brisbane, in Brisbane's CBD, was **announced the Joint Winner** for outstanding achievement in the category of 'Projects: Organisations with Paid Staff' for its exhibition *100% Brisbane*.

One of the most ambitious projects undertaken by Museum of Brisbane, **100% Brisbane** holds a mirror to the face of contemporary Brisbane and asks the question, 'who are we?'

This interactive three-year project maps, in real time, the changing views and beliefs of the city's residents, visitors and diverse cultural communities to capture how they feel about Brisbane. *100% Brisbane* also uses Australian Bureau of Statistics data to tell the story of the people living in this subtropical, new world city. The exhibition is complemented by a robust education program and suite of public programs, which encourage access and participation.

Museum of Brisbane worked with external creative practitioners on the project, including a multidisciplinary collaboration with Berlin-based theatre company Rimini Protokoll in the development of *Brisbane DNA*, involving 100 community participants, and resulting in a highly engaging, participatory experience that sparks conversation and generates ideas and self-reflection amongst visitors.

Presented by **Museums & Galleries Queensland** (M&G QLD), the GAMAA celebrate the outstanding achievements, professional excellence, and innovation of Queensland's museum and gallery sector. It also recognises the valuable contribution that our State's museums and galleries
