## LORD MAYOR'S BETTER SUBURBS GRANTS

### Brisbane City Council

**Funds:** \$10,000 - \$200,000

**Closes:** Community Facility Category: Check website for next round  
Community Support Category: 11 May 2026

**Purpose:** The Lord Mayor's Better Suburbs Grants program supports not-for-profit community organisations to run projects and activities that maintain, improve and develop community facilities. The program comprises two categories.

- The Community Facility Category provides funding to improve, develop and maintain Council community-leased facilities. Funding is available for both the planning and design, and construction phases of projects.
- The Community Support Category provides funding to support projects that respond to local community needs, improve community facilities and build organisational capacity. There are two rounds each year.

**Eligible applicants:** Brisbane Local Government Area-based incorporated not-for-profit organisations or organisations that are auspiced by an incorporated not-for-profit organisation that accepts legal and financial responsibility for the project or activity (Auspice Organisation). Community Facility Category applicants will also need to have a current lease of a Council community-leased facility and have authority to undertake the proposed works.

**Eligible projects:** Community facility maintenance, community facility development, organisational development.

## LORD MAYOR'S COMMUNITY FUND

### Brisbane City Council

**Funds:** \$250 – \$10,000

**Closes:** 12 June 2026, or when each ward has fully spent their allocated budget

**Purpose:** The Lord Mayor's Community Fund (LMCF) supports local projects that create stronger social bonds. Projects must contribute to the Brisbane City Council's aspiration to be a friendly and safe, active and healthy, clean and green, or vibrant and creative city.

**Eligible applicants:** Applications for funding can be made by community organisations for projects that take place in the Brisbane Local Government Area.

**Eligible projects:** Community events, equipment hire towards a community event, community facility improvements and equipment.

## COMMUNITY SUSTAINABILITY ACTION GRANTS

### Queensland Government

**Funds:** Up to \$50,000

**Closes:** Check website for next round

**Purpose:** The Community Sustainability Action grants provide grant funding to eligible community groups and individuals for innovative projects which seek to address climate change, conserve Queensland's natural and built environment and protect our unique wildlife. The program supports locally based, community driven projects which encourage real change in Queensland communities.

**Eligible applicants:**

- Owners of places entered on the Queensland Government's Heritage Register, including individuals and trusts.
- Non-profit incorporated organisations that are legally/contractually responsible for maintaining heritage-listed places on the Queensland Government's Heritage Register.

**Eligible projects:** Undertake urgent repair/conservation works on heritage-listed places, conserve the original heritage features of heritage-listed places, conserve heritage parks and gardens, prepare or update a heritage conservation management plan by a qualified heritage architect.

## GAMBLING COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND

### Queensland Government – Department of Justice and Attorney-General

**Funds:** \$500 – \$100,000

**Closes:** Check website for next round

**Purpose:** Grants are allocated to not-for-profit community groups to enhance their capacity to provide services, leisure activities and opportunities for Queensland communities.

**Eligible applicants:** Applications must be from community-based organisations with not-for-profit objectives that is incorporated or registered as an act of parliament (or sponsored by an organisation incorporated or registered as an Act of Parliament).

**Eligible projects:** The Gambling Community Benefit Fund website lists funding priorities for each round. Check the website for updated details.

Priority 1: Items/facilities directly affected, damaged or destroyed by a declared natural disaster in the last 2 years

Priority 2: Equipment and facility improvements

Priority 3: Buses, cars, caravans, boats, tractors, trailers, large mowers, motorbikes and similar items

Priority 4: Community events, training, workshops, festivals, publications and website development

Priority 5: Organisations that have received a grant or grants from the GCBF of more than \$15,000 in the past two years.

**Unlikely to be funded projects:** Salaries and wages, rent and lease costs, public liability insurance for events, administration expenses (stationary, office supplies, etc.), consumable items, internal training not provided by a third party.

**Ineligible projects:** Items purchased prior to approval, fees for services (e.g. grant writer fees), equipment or service that will benefit an individual, operating costs, help with generating income (e.g. sponsorships).

## AUSTRALIAN HERITAGE GRANTS

### Australian Government – Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water

**Funds:** Total funding pool of \$5.3 million

**Closes:** Check website for next round (opens late 2026)

**Purpose:** The Australian Heritage Grants program funds projects that do one or more of the following:

- maintain, protect and conserve the National heritage values of one or more listed places
- improve access to one or more listed places
- improve engagement with, and awareness of, the values for which one or more list places were listed.

**Eligible applicants:** To be eligible you must:

- be a site owner and/or manager of one of the listed places on Australia’s National Heritage List, or have the support of the site owner and/or manager of one of the listed places
- have an Australian Business Number (ABN), unless you are not entitled to an ABN
- You must also be one of the following entities:
  - a state or territory agency or body
  - a local government agency or body
  - Commonwealth corporate entity
  - an entity incorporated in Australia (includes registered land councils)
  - a partnership
  - an individual.

## QANTAS REGIONAL GRANTS

### Qantas

**Funds:** Total funding pool of \$2 million

**Closes:** Closes 10 May 2026

**Purpose:** The Qantas Regional Grants program offers \$2 million in support to Australian-based communities and projects that are looking to benefit the country's regional areas.

**Eligible applicants:** The program is open to individuals, groups or not-for-profit organisations seeking funds to contribute positively to regional communities.

## PLUS1

### Creative Australia

**Funds:** Matched fundraising for up to \$25,000 or \$50,000 depending on the size of the organisation

**Closes:** Check website for next round

**Purpose:** Plus1 is a dollar-for-dollar matched fundraising program, designed to boost the fundraising efforts of small-to-medium not-for-profit arts organisations. Plus1 supports not-for-profit arts and cultural organisations to develop and run more effective fundraising campaigns, boost their fundraising skills and secure new backers.

**Eligible applicants:** Plus1 is for small-to-medium organisations in Australia's arts industry. Creative Partnerships Australian define eligible organisations as those that:

- are a legally constituted entity (with an ABN) and are registered as a not-for-profit organisation (as defined by the Australian Taxation Office)
- have an annual turnover of less than \$5 million in the previous financial year
- are based in Australia, and are carrying out the majority of their arts activity or practice within Australia
- are operating with the primary purpose of providing arts and cultural opportunities for Australian artists and audiences

**Eligible projects:** The project or activity that will be funded through your Plus1 fundraising campaign is entirely up to the applicant. It can include, but is not limited to:

- Employment of artists or arts/culture workers (new contracts or continued employment of existing staff)
- Core operational costs
- Creating and presenting new works. For example, artist's fees, creative development, production, marketing, and touring costs
- Program initiatives. For example, education programs and/or scholarship opportunities
- Employment of new staff. For example, an artistic director, business development manager, or fundraising and marketing staff
- Fundraising support. For example, campaign expenses, customer relationship management, and IT software and hardware
- Capital works or building upgrades.

## TELSTRA'S CONNECTED COMMUNITIES GRANT PROGRAM

### Foundation for Rural Regional Renewal (FRRR)

**Funds:** \$200,000 available for grants up to \$10,000

**Closes:** Check website for next round

**Purpose:** Telstra's Connected Communities Grant Program will boost support for communities across remote, rural and regional Australia to improve resilience, environmental sustainability and liveability through the power of connection. The program seeks to foster:

- Resilient communities that are well prepared and socially connected when disaster strikes with the ability to renew and recover together;
- Sustainable communities that are diverse and inclusive, planning for the health, wellbeing, and prosperity of their people and the planet; and
- Liveable communities that have digital capability, and help to equip individuals with the skills to live, learn and work in a digital society.

**Eligible applicants:** To apply, you must meet the following criteria:

- Applicant organisations must be a not-for-profit organisation with either an Incorporation Certificate and/or an ABN. If you are unsure if your organisation is a registered not-for-profit (e.g., if you are a Co-operative, Other Unincorporated Entity, Public Company or Trust), please contact FRRR;
- Project must be for charitable purposes and offer clear public benefit;
- Not-for profit organisations with or without DGR-1 endorsement are eligible;
- Organisations can submit one application per grant round; and
- Projects must benefit communities in remote, rural or regional Australia.

**Ineligible applicants:** You will be considered ineligible if:

- Application is submitted by individuals, sole traders, private or commercial businesses (as per the submitted ABN);
- Application is submitted by an organisation that is not a legal entity (i.e. a registered not-for-profit), without the written consent of the governing / partnering body who holds the ABN / Incorporation Certificate;
- Application is submitted without required financial documentation (see additional information on the second tab);
- Overdue final report/s from any FRRR grants awarded in the previous seven years have not been acquitted (delivery organisations should check with legal organisation to see if there are any outstanding final reports);
- Application is for a project or activity that has already occurred / is occurring prior to the announcement of funding;
- Application is incomplete.

**Eligible projects:** A broad range of charitable projects are considered under this program, including:

- Delivering, or providing activities, events, programs and services;
- Purchasing or hiring equipment and materials;
- Community infrastructure projects;
- Organisational capacity building; and
- Community resource development.

## STRENGTHENING RURAL COMMUNITIES – SMALL & VITAL (SRC) Foundation for Rural Regional Renewal (FRRR)

**Funds:** up to \$10,000

**Closes:** 24 June 2026 (Round 29)

**Purpose:** The Strengthening Rural Communities (SRC) Small & Vital stream gives small remote, rural and regional communities across Australia the opportunity to access funds for a broad range of initiatives that directly and clearly benefit local communities (see website for more details).

**Eligible applicants:** Applicant organisations must be a not-for-profit organisation with either an Incorporation Certificate and/or an ABN. If you are unsure if your organisation is a registered not-for-profit (for example, if you are a Co-operative, Other Unincorporated Entity, Public Company or Trust), please contact FRRR. Of the three streams available in the SRC grants program (Prepare & Recover, Small & Vital, Rebuilding Regional Communities) organisations may submit their application in one stream, and any other applications will be considered ineligible.

**Eligible projects:** A broad range of charitable projects are considered under this program, including:

- Delivering, or providing activities, events, programs and services;
- Purchasing or hiring equipment and materials;
- Community infrastructure projects;
- Organisational capacity building; and
- Community resource development.

**Ineligible projects:** There are several areas that can't be funded through this program:

- Projects that support core business and areas of responsibility of Federal, State or Local Governments;
- Ongoing core organisational operational costs (e.g. rent, utilities, regular wages, loan repayments);
- The encouragement or advancement of sport, recreation and social activities are not considered charitable activities under Australian law. Applications from sporting organisations need to clearly demonstrate charitable outcomes and benefit to the wider community that are above and beyond the sporting activities of the club;
- Overseas travel and overseas projects;
- Prizes, gifts, trophies or awards;
- Political lobbying;
- Projects that primarily benefit private business, a sole trader, or private interests; and
- Projects solely focused on animal welfare.
