Council's Bankfoot House Heritage Precinct Commended

Museums & Galleries Queensland (M&G QLD) presented **Bankfoot House Heritage Precinct** with a Certificate of Recognition for completing an intensive year-long program assessing their practices against *The National Standards for Australian Museums and Galleries* at a special event held on 22 November 2017. Councillors Rick Baberowski and Greg Rogerson from Sunshine Coast Council, and Councillor Frank Wilkie, Deputy Mayor, Noosa Council joined M&G QLD to celebrate Bankfoot House's achievements.

Heritage-listed Bankfoot House, where three generations made their home, is located in Glass House Mountains, on what used to be the main road between Brisbane and Gympie. You can walk through the front door and experience the House as the family left it. Did you know that around 1868 the cost of a coach trip from Brisbane to Gympie was £3.10 (equivalent today to \$850), even though you could buy a horse for £2? It was a long and arduous journey and Bankfoot House was a welcome stop for travellers.
