Pioneer Cottage Buderim Heralded as a Significant Destination

Museums & Galleries Queensland (M&G QLD) presented **Pioneer Cottage Buderim** with a Certificate of Recognition for completing an intensive year-long program assessing their practices against *The National Standards for Australian Museums and Galleries* at a special event held on 22 November 2017. Councillors Rick Baberowski and Greg Rogerson from the Sunshine Coast Council, and Councillor Frank Wilkie, Deputy Mayor, Noosa Council joined M&G QLD to celebrate the Museum's achievements.

Pioneer Cottage Buderim is set in a colourful garden, built circa 1882 and stands on its original site. Did you know that this heritage-listed house is constructed of locally grown and pit sawn white beech, which is not readily attacked by termites? Red cedar was used for French doors in each of the four rooms.
