Ipswich Hospital Museum Recognised for Hard Work

Museums & Galleries Queensland (M&G QLD) presented **Ipswich Hospital Museum** with a Certificate of Recognition for completing an intensive year-long program that assessed their practice against *The National Standards for Australian Museums and Galleries* at a special event held on 3 December 2018. Greg Chemello, Administrator, Ipswich City Council and Councillor Jason Cook, Deputy Mayor, Lockyer Valley Regional Council joined M&G QLD to celebrate their achievements.

Ipswich Hospital Museum tells stories of the progress of local health services in the region. The Museum is located in the Jubilee building, the oldest and most ornate building on the Ipswich Hospital campus, high on Denmark Hill. Did you know the Museum's current display, 'Infections, Epidemics and Fevers of Ipswich', describes the treatment of fevers and infections before immunization and antibiotics were available to mitigate diseases?
