

## Logan City Historical Museum congratulated for their achievements in State Standards Review Program

Museums & Galleries Queensland (M&G QLD) was pleased to congratulate **Logan City Historical Museum**, Logan, at a **special presentation event** held on Friday 2 February 2024, at The Centre, Beaudesert, for completing the intensive year-long Standards Review Program, assessing their practice against *The National Standards for Australian Museums and Galleries*.

Located in the Kingston Butter Factory Cultural Precinct, the Logan City Historical Museum was established more than 30 years ago with a charter to preserve the history of the development of the Logan and Albert districts from the late 19<sup>th</sup> century to the present day.

The Logan City Historical Museum boasts a collection that tells the story of the local Butter Factory era and Logan's history in timber, farming, mining, involvement in both WWI and WWII, and a number of floods, fires and a tornado over the last century.

**Did you know** the Kingston area was known as "Butter Town" because of its association with the Kingston Butter Factory, which underpinned the local dairying industry for six decades? The Factory's weekly output of butter was between 40 and 50 tonnes by 1930. This historic site was transformed into the Kingston Butter Factory Cultural Precinct after the Butter Factory was closed in 1983.

**Did you know** there was a network of airfields in and around the Logan area operated by the American Airforce in WWII? The Logan City Historical Museum preserves the remnants of the boundary fence posts and barbed wire from Parkhill, Jacaranda and the Woodridge Airfield.

M&G QLD's Executive Director, Rebekah Butler, said,

"The Logan City Historical Museum is to be commended for their participation in M&G QLD's Standards Review Program. The volunteers have enthusiastically embraced this opportunity and are applying their learnings to improve visitor engagement and accessibility, and to strengthen the Museum's operations."
