












"the community, even my mother, told me that women didn't run farms" Dorothy Dunn 1891: Women farmers deliberately excluded from Australian census

1942-1945: Women's Land Army served a vital role, but weren't permitted to march on Anzac Day until the 1981

1994: Law reform commission: women can legally identify as 'farmer'

1999: Victorian Farmers Federation accept dual voting

2009:'Missed Opportunities Report' estimated women contribute 48% of real farm income

2018: Women in agriculture still face significant barriers and under representation on boards and decision-making bodies

Women's off-farm & unpaid work continues to remain largely undocumented, uncounted, unrecognised




