

Flying Arts is the new administrator of this important fund for Regional Queensland.









Australian Government Regional Arts Fund



The Regional Arts Fund (RAF) is an Australian Government program designed to benefit regional and remote arts practitioners, arts workers, audiences and communities. The fund is provided through Regional Arts Australia and is administered in Queensland by Flying Arts Alliance.





Objectives of the RAF

RAF supports and promotes participation in, and access to, Australia's arts and culture in regional and remote Australia by:

- encouraging and supporting sustainable economic, social and cultural development in regional communities
- developing partnerships and networks which leverage financial and/or in-kind support for specific projects and encourage ongoing collaboration
- developing audiences and broadening community engagement with the arts
- increasing employment and professional development opportunities for, and raising the profile of, regional and remote artists





Streams of Funding

- Community Project Grants (CPGs)
- Quick Response Grants (QRGs)
- Special Funding (e.g.Travel Grants for Artlands)





- Major funding of up to \$30,000 per application
- Cannot request 100% of project costs





- Fixed opening period usually 8 weeks
- Fixed assessment period usually 4 weeks
- Eligibility checked by a member of Flying Arts staff
- Assessed by a panel of arts industry professionals drawn from the Flying Arts peer assessment pool
- Fixed starting date for projects usually approx. 3 months after round opening date







Cairns based musical and cultural ensemble Women of AustraNesia received a CPG to produce *Woven*, a musical production that seeks to capture the essence of what is most powerful and enduring about the nature of woman.

"This was a wonderful production with honest and moving performances, song and storyline. The production spoke of the many truths for communities of the South Pacific which shape their lives." – Stephen Ung, FNQ Regional Director, Department of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships

Toowoomba group StoryARC received a Community Project Grant to facilitate a lantern-making and performance component of a larger community festival.

Feedback from participant





- Funding of up to \$3,000 per application
- Cannot request 100% of project costs
- Applications assessed by two members of Flying Arts staff





- Rolling fund, meaning applications are assessed as they are received
- Nominally open for approx. 11 weeks, but will close earlier if funds are expended
- Applicants (successful and unsuccessful) notified of outcome within 15 days of application submission date





- Successful applicants will receive funding within 10 working days of submitting completed acceptance paperwork
- Projects cannot begin within 4 weeks of application submission date

Fraser Coast Creative Space received funding to cover artist and curator fees to provide extension activities for the first artist in residence program.

As part of the exhibition, artist Akos Juhasz and curator Susie Lewis delivered art enrichment programming and two action performance artworks.

What the RAF will fund:

- Wages for artists and arts workers
- Materials for workshops
- Travel and workshop fees for professional development opportunities





What the RAF will not fund:

- Core costs of organising and running competitions, prizes, awards or fund-raising activities
- Curriculum/school-based activities (including school musicals and excursions) or tertiary course fees
- Infrastructure
- Non-arts related aspects of a project

- HOW MIGHT APPLICANTS ADDRESS THE RAF ASSESSMENT CRITERIA?

The RAF supports projects that support the funds objectives of:

- · encouraging and supporting sustainable economic, social and cultural development in regional communities
- developing partnerships and networks which leverage financial and/or in-kind support for specific projects and encourage ongoing collaboration
- · developing audiences and broadening community engagement with the arts
- increasing employment and professional development opportunities for, and raising the profile of, regional and remote artists.

The considerations listed below are customised to the purpose, objectives and criteria of the RAF.

Criteria

Possible Considerations

QUALITY

Proven capacity to support and/or deliver high quality arts and cultural initiatives in regional communities in response to identified need or demand

- Who will deliver the project? Provide evidence of the quality of their work (CV, outcomes from previous projects, letters of support).
- Does the project or activity involve a high standard of artistic or professional expertise in the arts and cultural sector?
- Does the project respond to a demand or need? In what ways?
 How does the project provide high quality experiences for audiences, participants, local community?





Quality

 Proven capacity to deliver high-quality arts and cultural initiatives in regional communities in response to identified need or demand.





Reach

 Provides access to social and cultural development opportunities for diverse communities, practitioners, participants and/or audiences.





Impact

Increases employment and professional development opportunities for artists and arts workers living in regional and remote locations.





Viability

 Demonstrates good planning, management and partnerships to increase support for the initiative and for arts and culture in the region.







Eligibility

Applications to RAF funding streams will be accepted from individuals, groups, incorporated not-for-profit organisations and councils which reside in locations classified as 'regional' according to the Modified Monash Model.

Using the Modified Monash Model Map

Residents of MMM2 - MMM7 locations are eligible to apply for this funding. Residents of MMM1 locations are ineligible.

To access and search your address in the Modified Monash Model please follow these steps below:

- 1. Visit the **Doctor Connect Locator** map using the link in this sentence.
- Located on the right side of this page is the layer toolbar. Under the heading "Department of Health custom remoteness classification", turn on the Modified Monash Model Layer by clicking the checkbox next to this layer name.
- 3. Enter your address into the address bar at the top of the toolbar to search the map for your MMM Class.
- 4. The map will now show you your MMM Class to check your eligibility to apply forthis grant.

What is the Health Workforce Locator?

The locator shows the <u>health workforce classification</u> and geographical information of any area.

You can see the workforce classifications:

- <u>Distribution Priority Area</u>
- District of Workforce Shortage
- Modified Monash Model
- The Australian Statistical Geography Standard Remoteness Area
- The Australian Standard Geographical Classification Remoteness Area
- Rural, Remote and Metropolitan Areas


