Eligibility

Who can apply for RADF funding?

RADF funds are aimed at the development of emerging and professional artists and creative arts workers. Individual artists and businesses can apply.

Applicants must:

reside or be based in the local council area/ demonstrate how the project will directly benefit arts and culture in the local council area

be permanent residents or Australian citizens

Who cannot apply?

Applications cannot be made by:

Government agencies or departments of state or federal government

Educational, religious or medical organisations, where the application is for the organisation's core business.



What cannot be funded through RADF?

Funds are not available for projects that:

- start before application is submitted
- include entertainment for events without a specific developmental outcome for artists
- are to fund a competition, a prize or an eisteddfod
- provide majority funding for publishing and/or printing costs
- are craft workshops
- seek costs of purchase of capital items, e.g. equipment, buildings or vehicles
- seek ongoing operational expenses.



Individual Development

For activities focussed on developing local creatives and showcasing the Sunshine Coast as a region of creative excellence

- Up to 65% of total travel, accommodation and registration fees for attendance or presentation costs
- \$750 for National Travel
- \$1,500 for International Travel





Mentorship Funding





Concept Development



One-off funding to assist in the Research and/or preliminary development of ideas for new projects.

Up to \$5,000



Project Funding



One-off funding for new, fully developed or established projects [and/or to refresh and revitalise existing projects and activities]

Up to \$10,000 for projects that benefit creativity in the local region






Seed Funding

Up to three years of funding for projects with a strong prospect of commercial success in the long term

Up to **\$10,000** - 1st year
Up to **\$5,000** - 2nd year
Up to **\$2,500** - 3rd year

Category: Project Funding

- Lead Artist Fee
- Videographer Fee
- Gubbi Gubbi Artist Fees
- Sponsorship contribution -\$4,800
- [Marketing, projector loan, staffing]
- ➤ In-kind artist hours, permits \$6,200








Case Study - Wildflower Women II

Funding for payment of:

- Curator Fees x 2; [Exhibition development/ curation, research/ development of historical component
- > Artist Fees x 4
- Artist Workshop facilitation





What makes a good application?



Letting your passion shine through

Sell yourself

- Don't assume the assessment panel already knows about your work - stand out from the masses!
- Let your passion for the project shine through!
- Clearly demonstrate to the grant provider why this project is necessary.
- Do not leave the panel with any unanswered questions.





Provide a clear budget

Ensure your budget is detailed and accurate

Include:

- An itemised list of all project costs
- All income for the project e.g. ticket sales, fundraising
- In kind contributions e.g. artist hours, volunteer hours and discounts

Don't forget to upload quotes to your application.

Support your application

- Include documentation and current letters of support from those involved or that will benefit from your project, or that endorse project
- Demonstrate evidence of partnerships
- Include artist bios/ resumes of those you are seeking funding for Include photos and concept designs
- Include current quotes
- Include relevant extracts from your organisation's business plan or meeting minutes as appropriate





Application & Assessment Process

- Speak to the RADF Liaison Officer about your project idea
- Complete an expression of interest
- Application is reviewed by RADF Committee

If your project proposal is accepted, begin full application process online
