Yandina & District Historical Society Recognised for Hard Work

Museums & Galleries Queensland (M&G QLD) presented **Yandina & District Historical Society** with a Certificate of Recognition for completing an intensive year-long program assessing their practices against *The National Standards for Australian Museums and Galleries* at a special event held on 22 November 2017. Councillors Rick Baberowski and Greg Rogerson from the Sunshine Coast Council, and Councillor Frank Wilkie, Deputy Mayor, Noosa Council joined M&G QLD to celebrate the Museum's achievements.

Yandina & District Historical Society operates Yandina Historic House, which includes a local artists' gallery, visitor information centre, gift and craft shop, heritage discovery room, as well as historical collections in the Museum space. Did you know that the first local railway bridge was built in 1870 and that the Museum's collection includes an original pylon? Without this bridge there would have been no Yandina.
