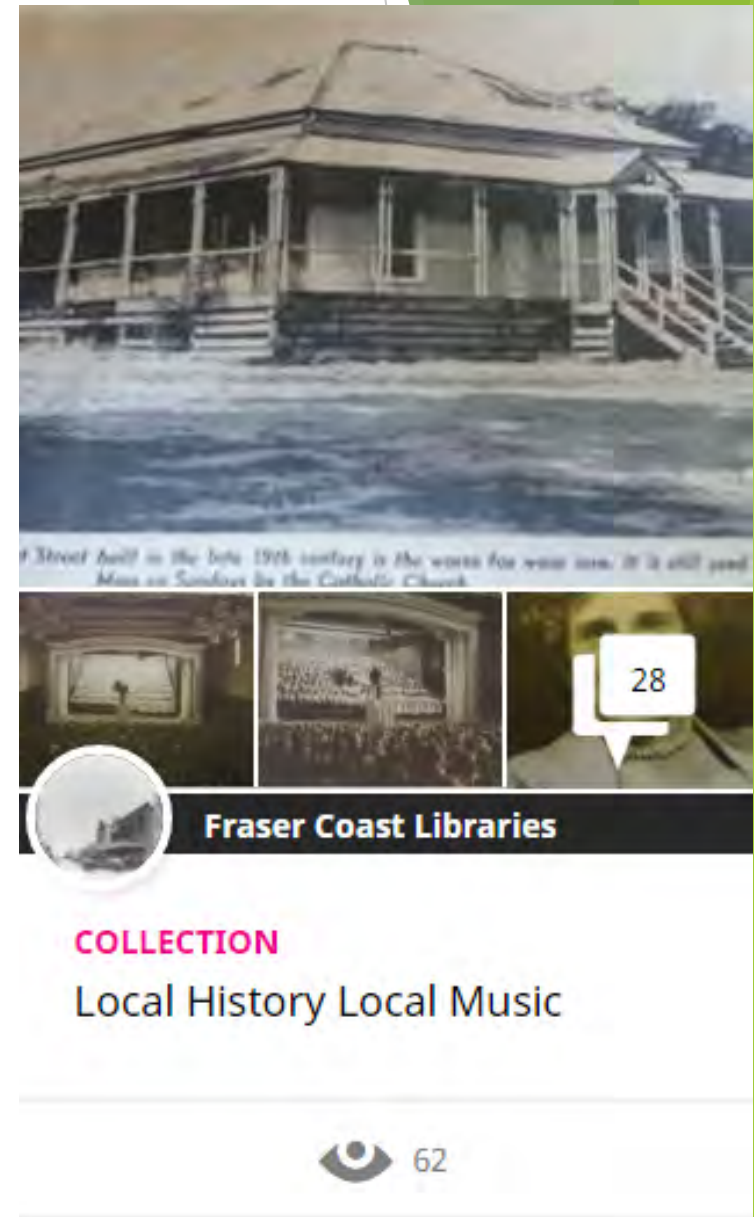

Challenges and limitations of community participation

- People apprehensive about utilising evolving technology but happy for us to do it for them
- People not realising the value of their historical memorabilia and knowledge to the community
- Getting people to help with projects and see the value when they are involved in their own projects
- Developing ways to build confidence and encouraging people to be more pro-active in their own projects



Synchronicity - all paths led to Wynne

- UQ emailed just in the middle of the project asking about Alfred and Olivea Wynne
- Wanting to have more to do with regional communities who benefit from be quested money
- Wynne is pivotal in all connections to do with music in Maryborough

What we have learnt:

- Lots of repetition, hands on activities and keeping the theory to a minimum
- Very time consuming and planning essential
- Do not assume people have skills
- Have a great morning tea

Where to from here:

- Continue building partnerships with museums and wider community
- Extend to digitising documents and audio and adding to Historypin and the catalogue
- Four projects a year
- Challenge ourselves to value-add to the Historypin content and improve the work we do
- Refine our methods of training and targeting projects to different people

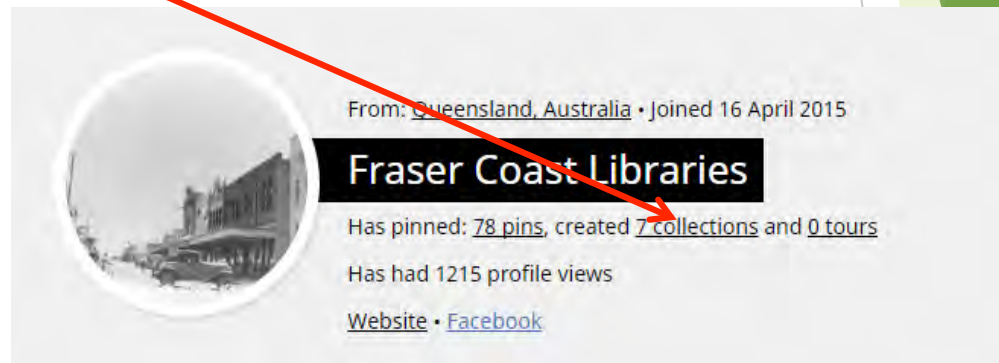
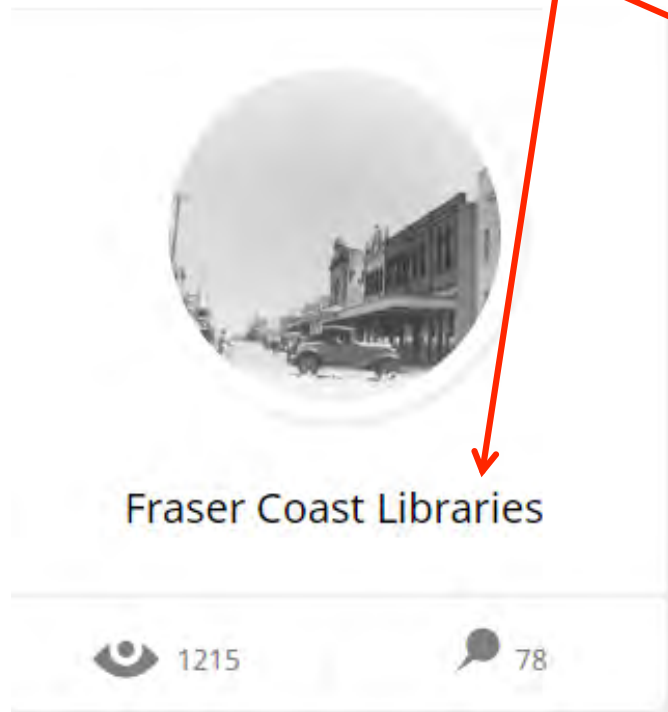

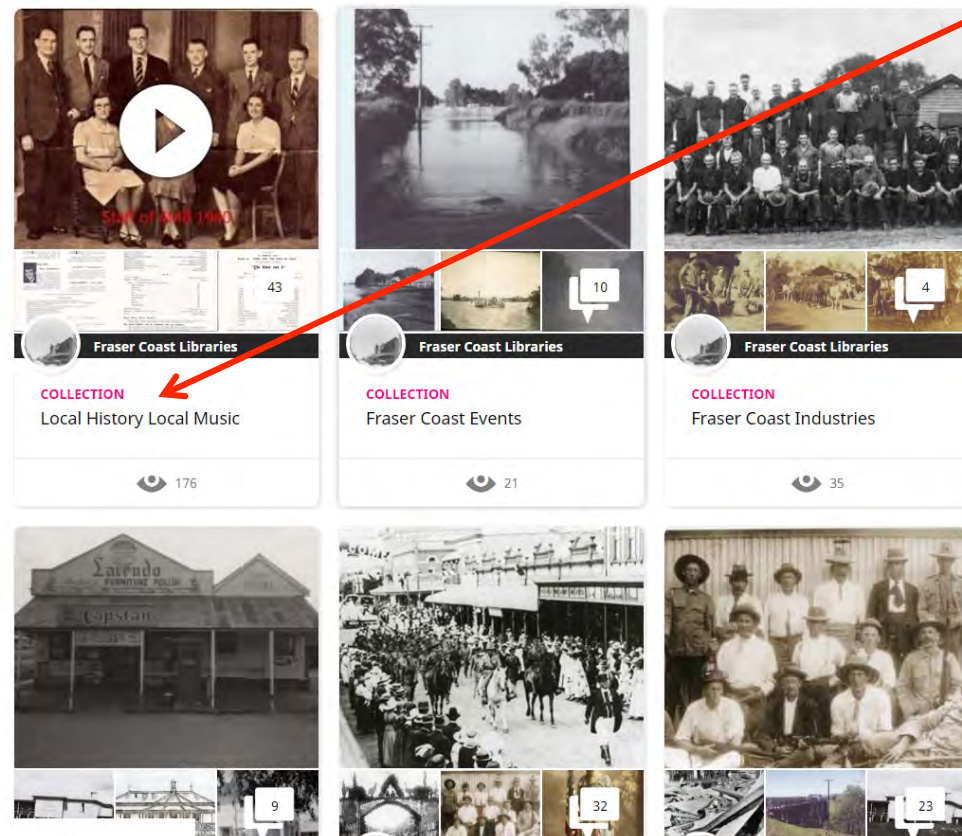
