## QLD's gallery and museum workers recognised in State Awards

**Museums & Galleries Queensland** (M&G QLD) proudly announced the recipients of the **2016 Gallery and Museum Achievement Awards** (GAMAA) at a gala event hosted by Creative Arts Redlands – Redland Performing Arts Centre and Redland Art Gallery, on Tuesday 22 November 2016.

Jenny Steadman, Vice-President of the Queensland Women's Historical Association (QWHA) was recognised as a Joint Winner for her outstanding achievement in the category of 'Individuals: Volunteer'.

Jenny's involvement with the QWHA dates back to 1990. The QWHA owns and maintains the house museum, Miegunyah House, a late 19<sup>th</sup>-century home in Bowen Hills, Brisbane. Since 2008, Jenny has been one of the Museum's driving forces, actively involved in its committee – her current Vice-President role involves ensuring the physical upkeep of the heritage-listed house and its day-to-day running.

Jenny's main role within the Association is that of Collections Manager, a volunteer role in which she has excelled. With a background in Australian history, Jenny quickly realised the significance of some of the items within the collection which has amassed since the 1950s. She is passionate about bringing the Museum collection and its comprehensive and astounding archive up to industry standards. This involves not only the cataloguing of the collection but also the conservation and preservation of items of state and national significance.

Jenny's graduating with a Master of Museum Studies course from The University of Queensland in 2014 is evidence of her commitment and devotion to the Museum and to its long-term sustainability.
