The Winners and Finalists of the **2019 Gallery and Museum Achievement Awards** (GAMAA) were proudly announced on Thursday 19 September at a special presentation event, held at the recently opened Cairns Performing Arts Centre, Far North Queensland.

Moreton Bay Regional Council was recognised as a Finalist for its outstanding achievement in the category of Engagement: Organisations with Paid Staff for its new Community Cultural Capacity: Curatorial Development Framework.
